1. Welcome

2. Apologies

Apologies were received from Dave Brookes, Tony Finn, Ruth Haigh, Shirley Rawsthorne and Mick Short.

3. Minutes from the last meeting

The following amendments were made:

4. Matters Arising

1) The sale of calendars and cards at the Green Fair went well. Deletions:

Water channels from the pond in West Field.

Labelling of Hawthorn next to the seat near Alder Pond.

The arrows on Lucy Brook.

Remove the label 'oak' from the tree on the pads footpath (below 'Abraham Heights') - this is not thought to be a significant tree.

Additions:

A better impression of the new access to Aldcliffe Road.

The Gun Range should be outlined and shaded but not named.

The Stump Circle in the Orchard should be included and labelled

The Shed should be included and labelled.

'You are here' should be place at the relevant point on the large maps at the end of Sunnyside Lane and the new entrance to Aldcliffe Road.

Label the oak on the pads footpath just below West Field.

Changes:

'Edenbreck Cottage' needs to be changed to 'Edenbreck Farm Cottage'

'The Triangle' needs to be changed to 'Aldcliffe Road Triangle'.

'Lucy's Pond' needs to be changed to 'Lucy's Pool'.

No apostrophe in Cromwells Pond.

Changes to the small insert showing the Triangle – as directed by Dave Brookes.

Change from a double to a single flower to indicate the arable field.

If possible, a bird that looks more like a snipe and less like a lapwing in Big Meadow

The arrow currently pointing to 'Lancaster City Centre' should point to 'Cromwell Road, The Aldcliffe Road Triangle and Lancaster City Centre.'

Decisions

It was decided to distinguish permissive and public footpaths.

The new footpath (for which we are still seeking funding) will be shown as 'proposed' on the maps for leaflets and as a 'permissive path' on the large maps for the noticeboards. The noticeboards will be kept in the shed until we have a path to put them on!
