7. Additional Items for Discussion

• Mandy advised that the cost of the newsletter will be £170, with the inclusion of Blades Street and Dallas Road, to be delivered the first week in June.

The worn rope has been replaced on the multi-unit.

One of the trees may be dead and, if so, needs to be felled at some point. There has been a lot of tree-climbing activity and also some vandalism to the trees. It was decided to include some information in the next newsletter and the Facebook page. Ken agreed to take out the lower branches of one of the trees.
